Year 6 pupils are getting close to their SATs tests now. Please help your child to prepare by continuing to encourage them to work through their revision books and My Maths over the holiday. Little and often will make a huge difference! Please make a note of the above date and ensure your child is in school this week, well rested and prepared. Thank you.

# Are you entitled to a £50 Voucher?

Our school receives money called 'Pupil Premium Allocation' (PPA) from the Government to help children who get 'Free School Meals' (FSM) or have had Free School Meals in the last 6 years, to achieve their very best in school. Please note this is separate to the school meals provided for Years R, 1 and 2.

If you have three children in school that would mean you could be entitled to £150 in Vouchers!

If your child has, or has previously had FSM in the last 6 years, Bransgore CofE Primary School has decided to support you directly by offering you the opportunity to spend £50 on equipment and/or uniform that can help support your child. This voucher can be used to purchase items that support your child's education eg uniform, PE Kit or reading book bag.

Each family will be given a voucher per child which can be collected from the school office and taken to PMG Schoolwear, New Milton to be used for payment. The 2016-2017 voucher must be spent by the 31<sup>st</sup> August 2017. A new one will be issued for eligible pupils at the start of the new academic year 2017.

Reception children will be issued with their voucher in June or July 2016. \*\* This offer is only available once per school year\*\*

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following;

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers' Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not also entitled to Working
   Tax Credit, and have an annual gross income, of no more than
   £16,190 as assessed by HMRC No other benefits qualify for
   free school meals

Registering is really quick and easy – if you think you qualify go online for an immediate decision by using the online Free School Meal Eligibility Checking Service provided by Hampshire County Council Catering Services (HC3S). This self-service option is available at: http://www3.hants.gov.uk/hc3s/freeschoolmeals.htm

Alternatively, if you want help in applying / completing the form please contact Mrs Saunders in the School Office and we can apply on your behalf.

If your child is in KS1 and receives 'universal free meals' you must still complete the form to apply for free school meals in order to qualify for your Voucher.

School uniform can be purchased from most clothes shops/supermarkets so long as it is consistent with our dress code.

UNNAMED ITEMS FOUND ARE PUT IN LOST PROPERTY WHICH IS LOCATED IN THE SCHOOL FOYER.



# Children's Handwriting and Artwork Project 2017




This Project is for children in Year 5 in primary schools. There will be prizes for the best entries, and every child participating will receive a small commemorative gift.
