WOW! We are halfway through our Spring Term and that also means that your children have been at 'big school' for 6 months and they are also halfway through their first year at Bransgore. Read Write Inc.

It is so rewarding to see that all the children are now bringing books home to share with you, this is due to their resilience and perseverance to develop their sound knowledge, we are all really proud of how well they are doing. Please continue to celebrate this with your children through the books they bring home on a

Friday and the online books available through BugClub. Support them to look carefully at the sounds and blend them to form the words, going back over the sentences to increase fluency in their reading.

This half term the children will be encouraged to increase the level of independent writing they are producing, as this will enable them to 'show off' their sound knowledge and the application of their phonics. I would ask that you encourage them to do this at home as well and prompt the children to bring any independent writing in to share with us at school. As always if you have any questions please ask.

Storytime

Thank you to all the parents that have regularly supported the children's love of literature through the fortnightly storytime. As we prepare your children for Year 1, this half term will be the last storytime sessions of the year.

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We have had a busy few weeks at our forest school site, exploring different media and artists. This half term we will be thinking about animals in the forest; who might live there, what they might eat and how we can help them. Forest schools forms part of our Early Years curriculum, it is a unique opportunity and provides children with important resilience and teamwork skills. The forest schools ethos is about the child leading in their learning and developing their self-esteem. All the adults that support your child in the experience ensure that your child will be able to engage fully with all the activities, often exploring new and interesting provocations.





January was a particularly cold month in the woods and some of the children struggled with this, therefore please make sure children have warm and waterproof clothing available on their respective days.

Uniform
