# **Right Respecting School Silver Award**

Another cause for celebration was our award as a "Silver" level UNICEF Rights Respecting School. Mrs. Craddock did really well in leading this work and was brilliantly supported by Mrs. Nyland in her role as Eco-schools leader and Mrs Waite and Mrs. Emecz in their role as global learning leaders. The children were great and the assessor was very impressed with all the children he met on the day. A key quotation from the report assessment said:

# Stonewall "Inclusion Champion" school award

As you know we are committed to full inclusion in our school and we try very hard to welcome everyone. To demonstrate this commitment we were keen to take up the invitation to be one of the first "Stonewall Inclusion Champion" faith primary schools. Stonewall is a charity set up to support full inclusion and acceptance for LGBT (Lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender) pupils. I am delighted to say that following training and attendance at conference we are now officially an inclusion champion school. This group of children are some of the most vulnerable in our school system at the moment and we want to help change this situation. ### **Parking for Breakfast and After School Club**

We are still very concerned that parents continue to use the school car park to drop off/pick up children at breakfast and after school club. We have had several reports of really dangerous driving and cars being left running while parents take children into the club. If some parents follow the rules, park elsewhere and walk their little ones into the club through the car park and others refuse to do this and insist upon driving into the car park, this greatly increases the risk to the children. Please do not use the staff car park to drop off/pick up your children at breakfast and after school club. We continue to try to find a better solution and hope to have this implemented for the Autumn term but until we do, please arrive five minutes earlier, park elsewhere and walk your child, under supervision, into the club. If parents continue to ignore this request then we reserve the right to refuse you access to the breakfast and after school service.
