Our "Telling School" ethos is still in place and we continue to advise the children to tell if they see anything at all that makes them feel worried or upset for themselves or someone else. Please help us by reinforcing to children that telling is always the best way to resolve worries and problems at school. Trust the teachers and grown-ups to listen and make safe and fair decisions. Keeping things to yourself or trying to handle it yourself is not usually the best resolution.

Thanks to our governors who work so hard on behalf of the school and the children, usually with little or no recognition or reward for their effort and dedication. You are valued and we are really grateful for the time and care you put in to help us be the best school we can be.

Finally, a huge thank you to you, as parents and carers, for the support you show to us as a school. Thanks for your encouraging and positive words and your love for our school. Thanks for supporting your little ones and doing the homework, learning the lines, shelling out for the trips, finding the milk bottle tops, remembering the MUFTI days, attending the VIP worship, helping listen to readers, reassuring your little ones when they worry and doing most of this while trying to run a home and hold down a paying job!
